FROM HUMBLE BEGINNINGS...

WHAT IS THE LEGACY YOU WANT TO LEAVE BEHIND?

In 1958, 17 faithful Baptist members answered a calling from God and acquired land in Rosebud, and with much sacrifice (both financially and physically) they built our original church shown as the cream brick building in the photo above. God rewarded their faithfulness with membership growing to the point that 30 years later an extension to the building was required. Again, through prayerful giving and volunteer work they completed the darker brick building in 1988. Little did those original members know of the legacy they would leave behind. Some 50 years later members of that same church would birth the COACH program, 60 years later they would birth the Community Hub church model. Both these initiatives have now gone on to become programs adopted by churches nationally and have forever changed the lives of so many people. Over the years the Rosebud Campus of New Peninsula Baptist Church has come to be known as a welcoming, caring and supportive church to not only our congregation but to the wider community. Now, more than 30 years since the last redevelopment it is our turn to consider what our legacy will be for future generations.

MAKING THE MOST OF THE ‘WELCOMING DNA’ OF THE ROSEBUD CAMPUS OF NPBC.

We hear it all the time from newcomers to our campus at Rosebud. “This is such a welcoming church here”. And they are right! It has long been in the DNA of the Rosebud campus to make newcomers feel welcome and connected. The challenge we have always had is firstly, to get new people consider our church given it’s old and tired face to the public, and secondly, trying to encourage newcomers to stay for a cuppa after the service. With our current set up we all need to leave the worship centre and walk outside 50 metres into the Activity Centre for morning tea. Many newcomers take this opportunity to get into their cars and leave.

As you can see from the image above, our redevelopment has the worship centre opening up into a large light filled foyer where we will have morning tea, thereby making it easier to stay connected with our newcomers.

This larger foyer will also allow for overflow seating (from the planned 150 we have) for days like Christmas and Easter services when we will often get larger numbers.

Finally, this large open foyer space will allow us to look at many other options to engage with the wider community, and also links the Worship Centre with the Activity Centre via a covered walkway. **(see back page for donation details)**
